It was set to a performance of the Sammy Davis Jr. song "Yes I Can", sung by Tony Dee of Brisbane, and accompanied by a band consisting of musicians with disabilities. Within four days of its premiere, "We're the Superhumans" was viewed at least 23 million times online and had a higher percentage of user engagement on Twitter than the release of the BBC's 2016 Summer Olympics trailer.

This clip is infectious and incredible. It showcases involvement in life—finding one's passion and pursuing it with commitment and zeal. As you watch the clip, channel your superhuman how can you do much more than you ever expected? What abilities have you been blessed with and what challenges

Year 8 Excursion

On Tuesday 7th May, our Year 8 students travelled to various locations across Brisbane to complete a field study relating to their current Geography unit of study: Changing Nations.

Wellington Point esplanade (coastal) Kelvin Grove (urban) Mt Coot-tha (mountain)

The objective was that students would gather data relating to how the area was being utilised and how it has been adapted to suit a rapidly changing and growing society.

Once students returned to school, they were placed in groups with students who travelled to the other locations, and as a group of three, they established which location and landscape, they felt had best been utilised to suit our society's needs.
